
Once the old police barracks on the estate at the time of the Castle being built, The Bridge House is now a specially dedicated space for learning.

The house and garden have been lovingly restored to act as a base for the Education Team who provide services to schools and other groups. Through creative and professionally written programmes they teach all ages about biodiversity and conservation. Families are also welcome to visit the centre for special events and a series of nature based talks, walks and teacher training courses are also scheduled throughout the year.



The Bridge House is an accredited Discover Primary Science and Maths Centre and we include aspects of STEM in each field trip or visit. The centre is also a Leave No Trace training facility and can offer courses and activities linked to this outdoor ethics education programme.

National Parks are leaders in Conservation Education. Our aim is to help all our visitors to get to know, care for and protect our landscape and biodiversity. We believe that by offering outdoor learning programmes and experiences, people of all ages can leave with greater awareness of the value of the natural world on which we all depend.

ECOLOGY & CONSERVATION FIELD TRIP (JUNIOR & LEAVING CERT.)

We can offer a field studies day tailored to the 'Habitat and Ecosystem' sections of the curriculum. Students will take part in hands on activities using scientific ecological methods and will record their findings in a useful workbook which can be used for revision at a later date. The aim of this day is to bring definitions of terms to life through real life examples of conservation work and science in the national park through the use of ecological surveys in the real world, and the work of ecologists and conservation rangers.

We hope that students will leave with a greater understanding of the interactions between different living things in a habitat and a sound understanding of why this type of work is important across a range of disciplines and careers.





#### RIVER STUDIES FOR GEOGRAPHY

We can provide a River Studies Day which involves a walk down the Glen path (7km) and a closer look at the work of rivers. Students will take part in interactive exercises, comparing the three stages of a river and will complete a workbook with their findings. This route offers some excellent examples of features such as waterfalls, meanders and ox bow lakes. We will explore the work of erosion and deposition, and examine the river load at various points. Map work is included in this day, as well as general discussion on the importance of freshwater habitats and conservation of important species present in them. Contact us for more information

TRANSITION YEAR: PROTECT NATURE PROJECT & CERT.

This is a unique learning experience for Transition Year students which aims to inspire change in values and attitudes towards the environment, sustainability, and outdoor recreation. It incorporates a school based project, an outreach visit to the classroom from Glenveagh's Education Team and a guided visit to the National Park. This programme raises awareness of nature conservation work carried out by the National Park while also delivering the core messages of the Leave No Trace Outdoor Ethics Education Programme. Students participating in the programme receive a certificate of completion.
