Who is this Module For?

 Foundation Ireland Discover Primary Science and Maths award
- Best suited to school groups who wish to spend a practical and hands-on day in the National Park incorporating aspects of STEM, touching on topics such as biodiversity, maths, sustainable development, geography, science, nature and woodlands
- Can be adapted to all ages and class groups

Learning Outcomes: What Your Group Can Expect

- An interactive, practical day in the outdoors, linking the natural world and STEM
- Learn about living things in the National Park, how they are connected to each other, and how to look for and observe them.
- Understand how maths can be used when learning about nature
- Find out about habitats, biodiversity, food chains, and conservation
- Carry out investigations in nature, and share findings
- Learn about what a National Park is, and why they are important







Before You Visit

To get the most out of your visit, there are a few things we suggest school groups do in class before coming to Glenveagh:

- Discuss National Parks and Nature Reserves, and why they are special and important
- Look at a map of Glenveagh, and talk about what you might see and find when you visit
- Do some research into what Biodiversity and Habitats are
- Encourage the class to think why surveys are done, why
 we need to monitor nature and why nature matters to us

Follow Up Back in Class

Take your learning back to the classroom. After your visit, you may want to:

- Conduct your own nature survey at school. Record and present your results.
- Carry out an investigation into something that you encountered on your trip to Glenveagh, and design a poster on it
