


The Geography of Glendalough: Weather



We mentioned the weather when we were planning what to bring with us on our fieldtrip. It is usually colder in the mountains than in the lowlands. Temperatures decrease as you gain altitude.

Record the weather on your fieldtrip.

You may also record the weather at your school before you leave, to give a comparison. (Note that the weather at the two sites will have been recorded at different times of day.)
