

The Gardeners Cottage

Introduction


This short guide introduces the reader to the Castle Gardens at Glenveagh National Park in Co. Donegal. There were two significant past owners whose gardening activity had a major influence on the development of the Castle Gardens. They are **Cornelia Adair** who gardened at Glenveagh from 1885 to 1921 and **Henry P. McIlhenny** from 1937 to 1983.

To create a garden in the middle of a wild upland Donegal landscape was very ambitious. '*Nature's Garden*' was already here in the form of the pockets of woodland around Lough Beagh in a landscape otherwise dominated by blanket bog. These enchanting ancient woodlands fittingly described as "**celtic rainforests**" are unique to the Atlantic coastline of north-western Europe and give unique character to the Castle Gardens and indeed the entire Glen. At Glenveagh the ancient wild woodland merges with the carefully tended garden, making for a magical combination.

Our climate of Donegal is described as maritime. The constant influence of the Atlantic Ocean and the Gulf Stream leads to a lot of rain (2000mm per annum) at Glenveagh, with mild winters and short summers. The Derryveagh mountains offer some shelter from strong winds that sweep in from the West and North West. The expanse and depth of Lough Beagh acts as a kind of radiator, ameliorating a local micro-climate where the native oak woodlands are carpeted with mosses, ferns, and lichens. Creating its own micro-climate the oakwoods flourish in these temperate rainforest conditions, characterised by high humidity and mean annual temperatures that range between 5–15 degrees Celsius.

The text is arranged as a walking tour of the Gardens, you should allow an hour to visit all the major features in the garden layout. The ‘designed landscape’ covers 11 hectares within the garden fence. Above the garden the landscape features extend into the oak woods to an area known as the Mossy Valley. The Gardens are readily accessible, with very good path surfaces throughout, in total there are 5km of paths around the Castle Gardens. Visitors who choose to walk to the Castle will find themselves entering the Gardens through the Pleasure Grounds – from where we will begin our tour.



The flowering year begins with a fine display of snowdrops in front of the Gardener's Cottage in February, followed in March and April by old fashioned narcissi and flowering tree rhododendrons. May and June are the main season for azaleas and rhododendrons, followed by masses of colour in the Walled Garden flower borders, in July and August. Autumn flowering trees include *Eucryphia x nymansensis* and *Rhododendron 'Polar Bear'*, and the last to flower is autumn crocus, *Colchicum* in October.

A catalogue of the plant collection within the Castle Gardens is included, detailing the 1,700 different garden plant species and varieties and a second list of 180 native wild species within the Garden. This is evidence that the Castle Gardens are the most biodiverse plant habitat in Donegal!

Pleasure Grounds

The idea of a “Pleasure Ground” comes from ancient cultures where – ‘pleasure gardens’ were made for Indian, Egyptian, Babylonian and Chinese royal palaces. By the medieval period, part of the land attached to European castles was set aside for the leisure of the occupier and their guests. Early examples were “privy gardens” attached to monasteries, palaces, and medieval Castles, made up of an enclosed private space next to the Castle with flower beds and a lawn for leisure use. Glenveagh’s Walled Garden evokes this quality of a medieval privy garden, as do the Pleasure Grounds and the great lawn.

The art of garden making was established at Glenveagh by Mrs Adair in 1888, when she gave instructions for the landscaping of the grounds around the Castle. This followed the untimely death of her husband John George in 1885, and two years later in 1887, the total destruction of their shared home at Bellegrove, Queens County (Co. Laois) by an accidental fire.

It is believed that Mrs Adair responded to these traumas by extending the Castle in 1888, making Glenveagh her principal residence in Ireland. The Castle's capacity to accommodate guests was increased with the addition of a new wing and stable block. Around the Castle, 20 acres of gardens were landscaped, vast quantities of soil imported, and thousands of Scots pine planted to provide shelter from the gales that sweep down the glen throughout the year.

THE PLEASURE GROUNDS LAWN was made by digging drains to reclaim the bog, where a layer of many disused bottles and jars were used to improve drainage and hundreds of tons of imported topsoil was spread over the top to a depth of 30cm. Some of these Victorian bottles and jars are now on display in a cabinet in the hall of the Stable Block.

The trees and shrubs we see surrounding the Pleasure Grounds lawn today are the result of two periods of planting. The earlier planting happened from 1887–1910. Surviving plants from Mrs Adair's time include hundreds of scots pine and "several *Rhododendron arboreum*, one good *Rh. falconeri*, *Griselinia littoralis*, *Cordyline australis* and three Chusan palms. To the south of the Castle there was an overwhelming amount of bamboo and some *Crinodendron hookerianum*" according to Henry McIlhenny writing in – *In an Irish Garden*.



John George Adair (1823–1885) and Cornelia Wadsworth Ritchie (1837–1921)



John George Adair created the Glenveagh Estate when he purchased the estates of Derryveagh, Glendowan and Manor Gore in 1857 and 1858. By 1859 the estate totalled 28,000 acres. Following the murder of James Murray in 1860, Adair served notice to quit to 46 tenant families. These 244 people were evicted in April 1861, earning John George Adair infamy as a cruel landlord.

Adair turned his attention to business opportunities in the USA where he had a brokerage business in New York City. There he met Cornelia Wadsworth Ritchie (daughter of American civil war hero Gen. James Wadsworth), they fell in love and married in Paris in May 1867. The development of the Glenveagh estate for sport hunting and the construction of Glenveagh Castle became their romantic project.

Glenveagh Castle opened to its first guests in 1873. The following year the Adair's embarked on their tour of the American wild west, which soon led to the founding of the JA ranch at Paulo Duro, Texas and a new brokerage firm in Denver, Colorado. While on business in the USA John George died unexpectedly in 1885. After the fire that destroyed Bellegrove (two years later in 1887) Mrs Adair decided to develop her Glenveagh Estate as her principle Irish seat.

Cornelia Adair is credited with the doubling of the accommodation capacity of the Castle (adding two major extensions in 1888 and 1901), the landscaping of the gardens around 1888, the introduction of the Red Deer and construction of the 45km deer fence (1891). Mrs Adair became a naturalised British citizen, her principal home was 30 Curzon Street in central London. She became famous in London as a society hostess, dressing in Empire matronly style, and known as "Chatelain of Glenveagh" "who is clever, rich and good-looking". Her high society circle included Lord Kitchener and the Duke and Duchess of Connaught.

Mrs Adair entertained guests each year at Glenveagh in August and September when weather and hunting conditions were at their best. Members of the British Royal family enjoyed the amenities of Glenveagh in 1902 and 1903. Mrs Adair's last visit to Glenveagh was in 1919. The influence of Cornelia Adair on the development of Glenveagh is evident throughout Glenveagh National Park.



An early gardening friend for Henry McIlhenny was his neighbour and advisor Lady Ann Leitrim. From her Leitrim Estate at Mulroy, Glenveagh was supplied with fully grown specimen tree rhododendrons to create instant impact. Many of the species listed in the 1948 invoice are still a feature in the Pleasure Grounds.

The second and major phase of landscape planting was carried out by **James Russell** in the 1950's. The historic garden made for Mrs Adair was re-landscaped for Mr McIlhenny. Russell brought in thousands of plants through Sunningdale Nurseries to create mass plantings of azaleas such as *Rh. occidentale* 'Superba'; scented varieties like *Rhododendron lindleyi*, *Rh.* 'Lady Alice Fitzwilliam' and *Rh.* 'Princess Alice'; Japanese azaleas, and bold foliage plants like *Hosta*, *Rodgersia*, *Phormium* and *Dicksonia*.

Notable specimens in the Pleasure Grounds include a collection of seven species of *Nothofagus*, *Eucryphia 'Nymansay'*, *Podocarpus salignus*, Japanese maples, *Drimys winteri*, *Eucalyptus species*, *Magnolia tripetala*, *Trochodendron araloides*, *Pseudopanax ferox* and *P. crassifolius*, *Fitzroya cupressoides*, and many Rhododendrons such as the blue leafed *Rh. cinnabarinum*, the orange barked *Rh. falconeri*, the glossy leafed *Rh. sinogrande* and the very rare *Rh. 'Kiawi Cross'*.

Nearest to the Castle, a spring feeds two ponds made by Mrs Adair's gardeners. Trees that now feature here include tree rhododendrons – *Rh. arboreum* and *Rh. sinogrande*, Chusan Palms – *Trachycarpus fortunei*, Japanese maple – *Acer palmatum 'Atropurpureum'*, *Fatsia japonica*, and *Cercidiphyllum japonicum*. These are underplanted with *Hosta fortunei*, *Primula*, *Bergenia*, azaleas and the native Royal Fern *Osmunda regalis*.

Unfortunately, some of the plant introductions have proved invasive and as a result are now being controlled. These include *Rhododendron ponticum*, *Alchemilla mollis*, *Gaultheria mucronata*, *Dicksonia antarctica*, *Lysichiton americanus* and *Gunnera tinctoria*. It appears that Glenveagh's temperate rainforest conditions favour the spread of these exotic species.

Henry P McIlhenny (1910–1986)



Born October 7th 1910, Henry Plumer McIlhenny was son of successful Philadelphia industrialist John McIlhenny. Henry was educated at Harvard where he attained a degree in Fine Arts in 1933. He was trained in museum studies and in how to collect with discernment. Paris was the centre for his art collecting purchases when he began to collect fine art paintings, later to concentrate his purchases in 19th century French painting. He served on USS Bunker Hill in WWII, and as curator of Decorative Arts at Philadelphia Museum of Art where he later served as chairman of the Board.

In 1937 at the age of 27 he bought the Glenveagh Estate from Lucy Porter, to serve as his Irish base in Europe. From 1947 he pursued his lifelong passion for gardening and art at Glenveagh, where he got great pleasure from entertaining and providing legendary hospitality.

Described as “American connoisseur of art and antiques, world traveller, socialite, philanthropist, curator, and chairman of the Philadelphia Museum of Art”. Andy Warhol famously described McIlhenny as “the only person in Philadelphia with glamour”.


Henry made a gift of the Castle and surrounding gardens to the people of Ireland in 1979. He had previously sold the estate lands to the Government of Ireland in 1975 for the purpose of establishing Glenveagh National Park.



Bali Statues – these were purchased by Henry McIlhenny while on holiday in Bali, Indonesia. They represent Temple Guardians meant to “ward off unwelcome evil spirits”. They add an air of the Orient to the Pleasure Grounds. Looking from the Statues, the lawn border to the right is planted with *Cedrus atlantica*, *Eucryphia*, *Senecio x ‘Sunshine’*, *Berberis thunbergii atropurpurea*, *Bergenia*, *Hosta*, *Rh. ‘Winsome’* and *Rh. ‘Vanessa Pastel’* and *Magnolia ‘Stellata’*. On the left, the lawn border is planted with *Pseudopanax crassifolius* and *P. ferox*, *Rh. ‘Kiawi Cross’*, underplanted with *Rh. ‘Seta’*, *Kniphofia caulescens*, *Euphorbia* and *Senecio x ‘Sunshine’*. Much of the planting is the choice of the renowned plantsman **Lanning Roper** who was a lifelong friend of Mr McIlhenny and ‘professional garden consultant at Glenveagh’ from 1959 to 1982.

The landscaping in the Pleasure Grounds is made up of a series of ‘set piece plantings’ such as: *Magnolia tripetala* and *Podocarpus salignus* under-planted with *Astilbe*; tree rhododendrons combined with bold foliage herbaceous plants, and contrasting foliage plants in purple colours like *Phormium*, *Berberis*, and Japanese Maple contrasting with the silvery foliage of *Olearia*, *Senecio*, *Astelia* and *Kniphofia*.

On the opposite side of the lawn, a *Nothofagus obliqua* thrives and is underplanted with spring bulbs. A strong piece of planting here by James Russell includes *Rh. falconeri*, *Rh. occidentalis ‘Superba’*, *Phormium*, *Rodgersia aesculifolia*, *Hosta*, *Rh. cinnabarinum*, *Rh. maceabeanum*, *Rh. bureavii*, under a canopy of native oak.

The Portico – was constructed in 2004, providing a focal point in the northern end of the Pleasure Grounds. Made from locally grown larch, milled by Robert McMahon of Trentagh, to the designs of Seán Ó Gaoithín and crafted by Jamey Bliss of Milford – it is modelled on a neoclassical design using the one-in-seven proportion. The borders that surround it are planted with *Rh. augustinii*, *Neopanax laetus*, *Hosta* and *Bergenia* with autumn flowering lilies.

To follow the circular path through the Castle Gardens, take the path through the gates to the right of the portico and stay right. The Belgian walk begins under a great *Griselinia*.

This path connects the lower Pleasure Grounds through native birch and oak woodland to the Kitchen Garden. The path was made in 1915 when Mrs Adair put her castle at the disposal of the British War Office during WWI. A group of injured Belgian soldiers came to stay at the Castle to convalesce at this time. They provided the workforce to assist the head gardener in making the path named for them.

The Belgian Walk climbs to the right between a large *Griselinia* over 100 years old to the left and giant Austrian Pines *Pinus nigra* ssp. *nigra* on the right that tower over the garden, planted around 1890. *Sasa veitchii* planted in the 1960's has spread to form an extensive groundcover here.

The Belgian Walk winds through the natural temperate rainforest with side paths leading to viewing points referred to by the old gardeners as "**Mrs Adair's seats**". One on the left known as "**the twelve steps**" follows a spiraling path through a wooded rocky ravine of birch, holly, yew and

rowan. This unique “**Celtic Rainforest**” habitat is celebrated for the great diversity found in its fern, moss and lichen flora. Filmy ferns make carpets on the boulders and bases of trees. Here ornamental plants such as *Cornus canadensis*, *Pseudowintera colorata*, *Fasicularia bicolor* and large leafed tree rhododendrons thrive. They were planted in the 1950’s to blend with the mysterious twisted boughs of birch and oak festooned with moss and lichen.

Mr McIlhenny wrote “one can get tired of endless naturalistic plantings, and long for formality – straight lines and hedges” and so with Lanning Roper to assist with design, the **Italian Terrace** was constructed 1969–70 on the Belgian Walk – “to give relief to the eye”. Furnished with antique 18th century neoclassical Italian sculptures depicting Vertumnus [the Roman god of the seasons and plant growth] and Ganymede [Greek god of desire]. These were shipped to Glenveagh in 1972 with a great many terracotta pots from

the Impruneta pottery near Florence. Great oil jars adorn the four corners, while hostas and azaleas fill these high-quality hand-fired terracotta pots. *En-situ* conservation work on the entire statue collection is ongoing (by Hall Conservation in 2022).

The Castle Gardens are planted with more than 200 species and varieties of Rhododendron. Along the Belgian Walk we find massed plantings of Azaleas, *Rh. ciliatum*, *Rh. hypoleucum*, and tree rhododendrons from the Himalayas which are placed as underplanting in the native oak woods. Just above the Italian Terrace is a cultivar unique to Glenveagh – *Rhododendron ‘Mulroy Vanguard’* with waxy red blossoms, planted in 1948.

As the Belgian walk nears the Walled Garden the path passes under some of Glenveagh's tallest native oaks. The other Mrs Adair's “**seat**” is found at the top of the “**Bee Path**” – it spirals to a high point where a stone seat sits under an old oak, in “Celtic Rainforest” facing toward the Castle through the trees.







Walled Garden

As the centrepiece of the Castle Gardens, the Walled Garden was made for Mrs Adair as a kitchen garden to supply fresh vegetables. The layout of six plots with bisecting paths is original to 1888. Each plot was filled with imported topsoil 1m deep. Local memory has it that the soil cost "a penny a cart load". The Walled Garden occupies the hollow made when a quarry was first opened in the late 1860's to provide granite stone for the Castle walls.

Snowdrops feature in January and February in front of the gardener's cottage, followed in March and April by a collection of old garden varieties of narcissi and a collection of new varieties bred by the Co. Tyrone based daffodil breeder Brian Duncan.

The walls, gates, box hedging and lead statue ornamentation, as well as the "Jardin Potager" style planting, were all added by Henry McIlhenny from 1947. As an art collector, Mr McIlhenny curated an entire lifestyle at Glenveagh that permeated through the Castle, Gardens and Estate. Mr McIlhenny was passionate about his garden, and this was evident in the expense he lavished on the Gardens over 47 years. This included the team of eight full-time gardeners who worked for him under the guidance of the garden advisor Lanning Roper and resident head gardener Matt Armour.

Lucy and Arthur Kingsley Porter both studied history of Art. They married in 1912, worked together on Porters Romanesque Sculpture of the Pilgrim Roads. They purchased the Glenveagh Estate in 1929 and immediately set about restoring the damaged Castle interior and renovating the gardens. The deer fence had been pillaged and was restored by Mr Porter at the same time.

In 1930 Mrs Porter gave flower seed to the young gardener Matt Armour to grow for the Castle Gardens. From this seed Matt raised the unique single

red dahlia that is such a feature of the Walled Garden each summer. It was named Dahlia 'Matt Armour' for Matt in recognition of his contribution to the Castle Gardens in 1996.

While living at Glenveagh Castle, Kingsley Porter wrote several plays and his well received *The Crosses and Culture of Ireland*. Arthur mysteriously disappeared – “drowned off the Irish coast” according to the New York Times of July 16th 1933. His widow Lucy continued to summer at Glenveagh where she held garden parties to raise funds for charity until 1937.

The charm of the Walled Garden is in its ‘old-world quality’. There is a sense of layered history here – with a backdrop of ancient landscape, castle towers and surrounding woodlands. The oldest and most precious flower in cultivation here is the red single-flowered – *Dahlia ‘Matt Armour’*, named for the gardener who first raised it in 1930. Matt served here as head gardener for 50 years. Lucy Porter gave Matt *Dahlia* seed she brought from the USA and from these seed Matt raised the single red *Dahlia*.

The perennial flower borders that cross the centre and surround the walled garden are stocked with *Geranium psilostemon*, *Phlox*, *Eupatorium*, *Inula*, *Lysimachia*, *Campanula lactiflora*, paeonies, monkshoods, day-lilies, lupins, delphiniums, aconitums, euphorbias, *Silene fimbriata*, primulas, narcissi, poppies, climbing roses, wisteria, camellia, fuschia – to name a few. Rare native trees are grown as ornamentals such as Spindle *Euonymus europaea* and Irish Whitebeam *Sorbus hibernica*.

A good collection of Irish apple varieties grown as standards and espaliers have been added since the year 2000, with varieties like ‘Irish Peach’, ‘Kerry Pippin’, ‘Ross Nonpareil’, ‘Leitrim Red’, ‘Sheeps Nose’ and ‘Irish Pitcher.’

The organically grown vegetables, herbs and annual flowers that fill the plots include – kale and purple cabbage, the giant locally sourced ‘Gortahork cabbage’, peas and beans, beetroot and swiss chard, parsley, chamomile, calendula, fennel and feverfew, all planted now for ornament as “floral art”.

The Gothic style Orangery designed by Phillippe Julian, a French cultural historian and friend of Mr McIlhenny, was added in 1957. Mr McIlhenny wanted lemons and oranges cultivated in pots. There are several lemon varieties here in cultivation together with *Brugmansia*, *Ficus pumila*, *Jasmine*, *Strelizia*, *Sparmania*, *Puya* and *Agave*.


ROSE GARDEN

Created in the 1960s, trial and error led to the decision to plant the rose garden with shrub roses, as they are best suited to the peaty soils of Glenveagh. Rugosa roses do best with varieties such as *Rosa rugosa* ‘Scabrosa’, ‘Sanders White’, ‘Pink Grootenhurst’, ‘Frau Dagmar Hastrup’ and ‘Roserie de l’Hay’. Unusual species include *Rosa roxburgii* and *Rosa rubrifolia*. In more recent times old style cottage garden roses collected from around County Donegal have been planted in beds on the lawn, together with the hybrid tea varieties ‘Dublin Bay’ ‘Bantry Bay’ and ‘Galway Bay’. *Leucojum vernum* flowers under the roses in early spring and *Colchicum* ‘Waterlily’ provides late autumn colour. The two circular Gazebos, roofed with wooden shingles were added in the late 1960’s.

Made to Mr McIlhenny's design, the View Garden was planted with silver and glossy foliage plants, to create a shimmering effect by reflecting light. Planting includes *Olearia*, *Eleagnus*, *Senecio*, ivy and holly. In the centre of the path is the native tree, *Populus tremula* – Trembling Aspen – perhaps the most ancient of all trees in Glenveagh and an inhabitant of this landscape for thousands of years. Granite balls ornament the gate pillars and a “pixie ring” planted with hawthorn surrounding a circular lawn fills a hollow with a fine view of the lake and Glen beyond.

ORIENTAL GARDEN

The shelter is modelled on a ‘Japanese tea-house’ and the planting is in the oriental style with Japanese purple maples *Acer palmatum ‘Atropurpureum’* grown from seed collected from a mature specimen in the Pleasure Grounds. A small pond mimics Glenveagh lake and surrounding hills. Around it the native Woodrush *Luzula sylvatica* and Patagonian *Gunnera magellanica* are planted. The thickets of bamboo surviving and thriving from Mrs Adair’s time, are the Arrow Bamboo *Pseudosasa japonica*, giving this part of garden an oriental feel.

SWISS WALK

There is a sense that this woodland garden developed first by Henry McIlhenny in the 1950's is a play on the renowned landscape gardens made for Henry Francis du Pont at Winterthur, Pennsylvania, a friend of Mr McIlhenny. The style of planting mimics a Swiss Alpine woodland, with pine trees underplanted with azaleas *Rh. luteum* and spring flowering herbs.

The Swiss landscape architect Walter Bruger is credited with the design and layout of this part of the garden which includes the Italian style Tuscan garden. Here Mr McIlhenny acquired some 'borrowed antiquity'. Laid out in the classical formal style of Roman Emperors, the Tuscan Garden has a gallery of Carrara marble busts depicting Roman Emperors and their wives and overlooked by life-size statues of the Roman Gods Bacchus and Flora. Mr McIlhenny had all these statues shipped to Glenveagh from Florence in 1958.

The evergreen foliage planting of the Tuscan Garden is finished with *Griselinia littoralis*, Mr McIlhenny's choice, with a canopy of *Eucryphia* and Scots Pine above.

POOL AND BOAT HOUSE

The Boat House was first constructed for Mrs Adair, to house rowboats used by the Castle guests for sport fishing, such as for salmon and sea trout. The design, construction and finishing of the heated outdoor swimming pool in 1970 was the combined effort of Mr McIlhenny's staff that included Julian Burkett, Tommy Ryan and Lanning Roper. The pool now hosts waterlilies and there is a phenological garden planted on the grass under the Castle Terrace. Phenology is the study of the seasonal changes that occur in relation to plant growth and climate. A record is kept of flowering, leaf unfolding and leaf fall.

THE CASTLE COURTYARDS

There are six courtyards around the Castle.

The outer **Forecourt** is planted with evergreen Camellias where the park shuttle bus stops. Camellias usually flower in March, but they have value as glossy evergreen foliage plants all year round. There are several specimens of the unusual *Camellia cuspidata*.

The **Hall Yard** has been kept plain in style, with a gravel surface and surrounding fuschia hedges that are underplanted with the native Kidney Saxifrage *Saxifraga hirsuta*. *Parthenocissus veitchii* clings to the walls and provides warm colours in autumn. In a similar fashion the Castle Lawn, on the west side of the Castle is given the minimal treatment, with escallonia hedges hugging the base of the building. Above the Hall Door is the Adair family crest with motto “Loyal au Mort” [loyal to death, carved in Kilkenny limestone] placed there by Mrs Adair after her husband’s death.

The **Flag Yard** occupies a sunny sheltered position. It is paved with black and white marble salvaged from Ards House near Creeslough in 1966–67. The terracotta pots from Florence are planted with azaleas, and the strong Mediterranean atmosphere is added to with planting of *Clematis montana*, a fruiting fig tree *Ficus ‘Brown Turkey’*, camellia varieties, yellow flowered *Rosa banksii* and the scented white flowering *Osmanthus x burkwoodii*.

The **Stable Yard** is overlooked by the old Castle Stable building, now housing the public toilets, a gallery through which you can access the Orangery and Walled Garden and a gift shop. The surrounding walls of the yard are planted with *Ficus pumila*, *Parthenocissus henryi*, *Pyracantha* and native ivy. The great Italian terracotta pots from Florence are planted with azaleas, with spring and summer bedding flowers.

At Glenveagh we care for biodiversity by gardening with nature. The walled garden is managed using organic techniques, we compost garden waste, and we protect and encourage native plant communities. This is in recognition of our interdependence with the plant world, our work is to promote and conserve **plant life and diversity** that is fundamental to sustaining life on Earth. Glenveagh National Park is managed by the National Parks and Wildlife Service, Government of Ireland.
